A day in Manila

- Visit Makati City financial district, and nearby is Forbes Park, fittingly dubbed as "Millionaires' Row.
- Next is the historic Rizal Park where the remains of the Philippines' national hero, Dr. Jose Rizal, lie within the Monument.
- Then to the walled city of Intramuros, the oldest structure in the country, which dates back to 1571.
- After is Fort Santiago which served as headquarters of the military for the Spanish, American and Japanese colonizers until its destruction in 1945.
- Finally drop off at Mall of Asia.
